Aging & Disability Services (ADS) plans, coordinates, and advocates for a comprehensive service delivery system for older adults, family caregivers and people with disabilities in King County.

ADS, a division of the Seattle Human Services Department, works in partnership with King County and United Way to improve the health and quality of life for seniors and adults with disabilities; connect seniors and adults with disabilities with helpful resources; and provide help and support for caregivers.

Area Plan on Aging

The Area Plan on Aging charts the course ADS will follow to create an elder-friendly community. Revised every four years, the plan presents demographic trends and outlines major goals and objectives, including:

- Improve health care quality for older adults and adults with disabilities.
- Address basic needs.
- Improve health and well-being.
- Increase the independence for frail older adults and people with disabilities.
- Promote aging readiness.



Funding

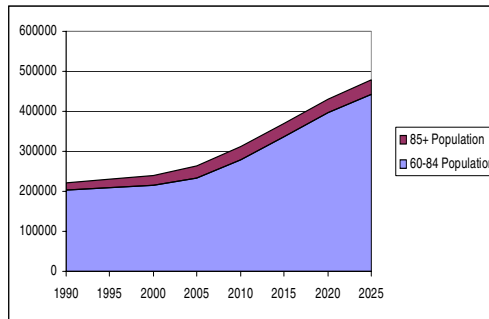
ADS plans and funds programs and services that benefit older people and adults with disabilities so they can remain independent in their home and communities of choice. ADS administers approximately \$70 million annually, including federal, state and local funds.

Advisory Council

The Advisory Council on Aging and Disability Services comprises 27 volunteers appointed to guide the agency’s planning and funding decisions. Chartered under the Older Americans Act of 1965, the Council has a significant role in advocating on behalf of older adults in King County.



Aging King County

By 2025, nearly one-quarter of King County’s population will be over age 60. The number of residents age 85+ is growing rapidly. King County’s older population is racially and ethnically diverse, and will become more so in the years ahead. Today, older adults tend to be healthier than the generation before them, yet many require special care to remain at home. Approximately 80 percent of people serving as caregivers for older adults or adults with disabilities are family members.
