Budget Overview

City of Seattle - General Fund

The City of Seattle budget process is underway. The Mayor will present his 2017 budget in September. The City Council will adopt the final budget by the end of November.

Federal

For 2017, there are slight increases in Title III - Family Caregiver Support and Title III-C - Nutrition.

State

Washington State DSHS allocates the Senior Citizens Service Act and Older Americans Act funds to Area Agencies on Aging using a funding formula that is based on local Census data (such as the number of adults age 60 and over; the number of individuals with a disability; poverty levels; and the number of individuals who are limited English-speaking). Because more growth occurred in counties outside of King, ADS experienced funding reductions that began in 2014. This is the last year of the funding formula reduction for King County. The increases in Federal funding will offset the State funding formula reduction. Due to this offset, the proposed 2017 budget will be status quo.

Next Steps

Following the public comment period, the P&A Committee will meet to review and consider all comments submitted. Their final recommendations will be forwarded to the Advisory Council for approval on August 12. The final draft recommendations will then be forwarded to the ADS Sponsors for adoption on August 25.
