Fixed route transit does not meet the needs of many older adults and people with disabilities.




What the transportation barriers look like

- Roundtrip service to a single destination take up to half a day




How much safer & faster transportation costs



• How can we fund it?

Advocate for regular equitable maintenance of critical pedestrian infrastructure: Seattle can't be age friendly without it

- Regrade the thermoplastic crosswalks rather than repeatedly painting over existing lines
- More regular maintenance/replacement of elevators and escalators
